

Jokamachi Area

Sasayama Jokamachi (Castle town) is centered around the ruins of Sasayama Castle, a castle built in 1609 as part of the Tenka-bushin (National) project ordered by Tokugawa Iyeyasu. Sasayama Jokamachi retains the basic structure of a castle town from the early modern period - it has a samurai town and merchant town layout. Its historical atmosphere has been painstakingly preserved to this day. It was recognized as a Japanese Important Preservation District for Traditional Buildings in 2004, and also as one of the 100 most beautiful historical environments in Japan in 2007.

TAMBA SASAYAMA MAP

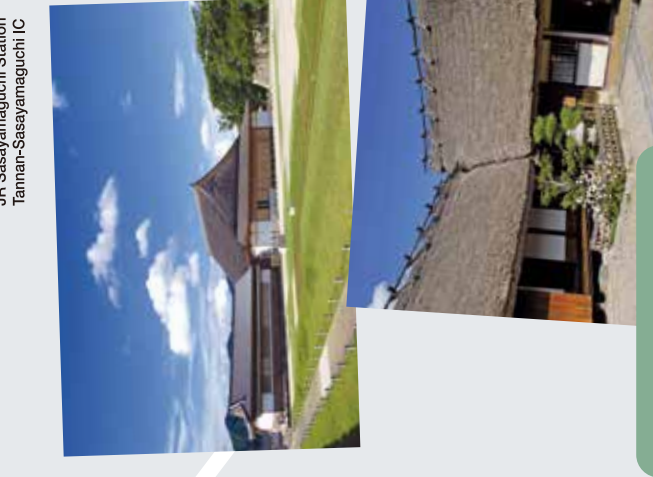

FUKUSUMI AREA

Fukusumi prospered as a lodging town in the Edo period; tsuimari-style townhouses and thatched farmhouses stand side-by-side along a 3.3km stretching from east to west. Sumiyoshi Bridge is located in a somewhat central part of the main street. A lodging town is located on the western side and a rural farming village on the eastern side. All of these make for a fantastic streetscape! These two historical landscapes; a lodging town and a rural farming village, are both located along one street - an extremely rare occurrence in Japan. It was selected as an Important Preservation District for Traditional Buildings in 2012, the second such district in the city.

Mt. Takashiro, where Hatano Hideharu's castle, Yakami Castle, was built, is also called "Tamba Fuji" and is designated as a National Historic Site. Yakami Castle was the scene of the Akechi Army's four-year attack on Tamba, and was renowned as an invulnerable mountain castle in the Warring States Period, but the castle fell in 1579.
