- ① Sasayama Castle and Oshoin**
The Oshoin once stood in Sasayama Castle's Ninomaru (second citadel) for about 340 years until it was destroyed by fire in 1944. It has now been restored to its original glory for the first time in half a century. The classical architectural style and majestic decorations have all been reproduced as they were in the past.

- ② Samurai House Anma Historical Museum**
The Anma House was a standard samurai residence for the retainer of the Aoyama clan, the lord of the Sasayama domain. Tableware and furniture used by the Anma family are on display inside the house, giving visitors a glimpse into the lifestyle of the time.

- ③ Aoyama Historical Village (Tamba Sasayama Dekansho Museum)**
The former second house of the descendants of Aoyama clan, a number of historical and cultural documents from the Edo period are housed here. Tamba Sasayama Dekansho Museum also introduces Tambasasayama as "a Japanese Heritage City" included in "Dekansho-bushi," a song with lyrics based on the history and culture of the area.

- ④ Historical Museum (Former District Court of Sasayama)**
This art museum was originally a Western-style building built in 1891 before renovation. The museum exhibits many masterpieces unique to Tambasasayama, an area which has long excelled in arts and crafts.

- ⑤ Taisho Roman Hall**
Originally completed in 1923 as the Sasayama Town Hall, this Western-style building ceased use as a town hall in 1992. It was renovated and reopened in 1993 under the name "Taisho Roman Hall". It is now used as a base facility for sightseeing in the castle town of Tambasasayama. A restaurant and a shop selling a variety of Tambasasayama souvenirs can be found inside.

- ⑥ Kasuga Shrine Noh Stage**
National Registered Cultural Property. The Noh stage was built and dedicated by Aoyama Tadayoshi in 1861, the feudal lord of the time. 160 years have passed since then, and the traditional performing arts are still being passed down through bi-annual dedications of the Noh plays "Okina" on New Year's Day after midnight and "Kasuga Noh" in the spring, as well as Kyogen plays.

- ⑦ Kawaramachi Tsumairi Merchant Housing District**
Kawaramachi was established in 1620 after the construction of Sasayama Castle. It is a traditional townscape of Tsumairi-styled merchant houses with depth and with narrow frontage of 5 to 8 meters. Designated as a Nationally Important Preservation District for Traditional Buildings, the Senbon-koshi, Ara-goshi, Sodekabe, and Udatsumi and other features convey the unique appearance of a castle towns of the past. Restaurants, cafes, and souvenir stores also line the streets.

- ⑧ Okachimachi Samurai Residences**
Sasayama Castle was completed in 1609 and the castle area was divided into towns. It was at this point that Okachimachi area was created. Samurai were assigned to live on both sides of the street on the west side of Nishiboribata (the west moat). More than a dozen samurai residences still remain here and retain the atmosphere of those days. The area has been selected as an Important Preservation District for Traditional Buildings.

- ⑨ Ojiyama Makekirai Inari Shrine**
"Makekirai Inari" located at Ojiyama Inari on the west side of Ojiyama Park, was named after an Edo period sumo wrestler named Ojiyama Heizaemon. It is widely worshipped as the God of good fortune, disaster prevention, business prosperity, and victory. It is also commonly believed to provide luck to pass entrance examinations from its name, "Makekirai" ("hate to lose"). It is also famous for its cherry blossoms and autumnal leaves.

- ⑩ Ojiyama-yaki Ojiyama Pottery Center**
Ojiyama is a kiln established by the feudal lord Aoyama Tadahiro in the Bunsei Era (late Edo period). Once Aoyama Tadahiro had decided upon the Ojiyama area he invited master potter Kinkodo Kamesuke from Kyoto so that he could teach his skills. The kiln once laid unused but was painstakingly restored in 1988 as the "Ojiyama Pottery Center". Pottery classes are also available here, as are the displaying / selling of exhibits in the exhibition hall.

- ⑪ Ojiyama Park**
Ojiyama refers to a small hill to the east of the ruins of Sasayama Castle. The park is renowned for its spectacular views of Tambasasayama townscape, as well as its cherry blossoms and autumnal leaves. Ojiyama was once considered as one of the candidate sites for Sasayama Castle alongside Sasayama and Tobinoyama.



Jokamachi Area

Sasayama Jokamachi (Castle Town) is centered around the ruins of Sasayama Castle, a castle built in 1609 as part of the Tenka-bushin (National) project ordered by Tokugawa Ieyasu. Sasayama Jokamachi retains the basic structure of a castle town from the early modern period - it has a samurai town and merchant town layout. Its historical atmosphere has been painstakingly preserved to this day. It was recognized as a Japanese townscape of significant value and was selected as an Important Preservation District for Traditional Buildings in 2004, and also as one of the 100 most beautiful historical environments in Japan in 2007.



Maruyama Village
